 Contains restrictions and limitations on voter rights reminiscent of Jim Crow era legislation

Jim Crow laws were state and local laws enacted in the post-Civil War era until 1968 that legalized racial segregation in the southern states and denied African American citizens basic rights, including the right to vote.

- Adds several new vote-by-mail restrictions including:
 - Application must provide voter ID numbers must now be provided on application (i.e., driver's license, social security, or state identification)



Repeals the law permitting Election Boards to mail absentee ballots to ALL eligible voters – registered or not – who apply.

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• Bans most out-of-precinct provisional ballots



- Bans most out-of-precinct provisional ballots
- Voters have the right to cast a provisional ballot at the polling location where they are (the wrong location) *in the county where they are registered* to vote. However, the new law states that the provisional ballot will *NOT BE COUNTED*. There is an exception. IF the voter
 - 1. decides to vote provisionally,
 - 2. is voting in the wrong voting precinct,
 - 3. is voting in the county they are registered,
 - 4. shows up to vote after 5:00 pm but before regular closing time ON ELECTION DAY, and
 - 5. signs a very specific sworn statement

their provisional ballot WILL BE COUNTED.



- Bans outside placement of drop boxes unless the Governor declares a public emergency
- Relocates drop boxes to the inside of voting locations rendering them *inaccessible after voting hours*.
- Establishes a minimum of one (1) drop box per county and a max of *the lesser of*:

One (1) drop box per 100,000 active registered voters per county

The number of advance voting locations in the county

 Reduced drop boxes drive utilization of less secure United States Post Office



- Bans utilization of mobile voting units unless approved by Governor
- Bans the acceptance of private grant money by County Election Boards
- Limits voting resources in non-general elections
- Makes it a crime to
 - Hand out snacks or water to in line voters
 - Accept snacks or water from a volunteer/group
 - Allow an *unauthorized* person to watch you mark your absentee ballot at home
 - Watch someone mark their absentee ballot if you are unauthorized
 - Handle an absentee ballot if you are not authorized to assist the voter
 - Photograph any absentee ballot



AUTHORITY SHIFTED TO STATE ELECTIONS BOARD!!

- Secretary of State removed as chair of Georgia Elections Board. The state legislature has been empowered to appoint a new chair
- Georgia Secretary of State can no longer
 - Vote on GA Elections Board agenda items
 - Appoint members of Performance Review Board
 - Send unrequested vote-by-mail applications
- *Removes* judicial oversight of the GA Elections Board
- Grants GA Elections Board the *power to sanction* organizations for mailing absentee ballots

TAKE ACTION VOTE!! In order to register to vote in Georgia, you must meet the following five requirements

- Be a United States citizen.
- You have to be a resident of Georgia and live in the county and voting precinct where you will vote.
- You can register to vote when you are 17.5 years old, but you must be 18 years old by Election Day to vote.
- If you have been <u>convicted of a felony</u> you must be "Off Paper" to register. Off Paper means that you've served your sentence, completed probation/parole and paid any fines that are related to your sentence, or have received a pardon for your conviction.
- If you have been declared mentally incompetent by a judge, you cannot register to vote in Georgia.

2021 Municipal Election Dates

- 08-16-21 Earliest day to apply for absentee ballot
 10-04-21 Last day to register for General and Runoff Elections
- 10-11-21 Earliest day that county registrars may mail absentee ballots
- **10-12-21** Early voting begins
- 10-22-21 Last day to submit absentee ballot application for General Election
- 11-02-21 Election Day
- 11-19-21 Last day to submit absentee ballot application for Runoff Election

Federal Legislation

H.R. 1

For the People Act of 2021

- Passed US House by a vote of 220-210. Stalled in the US Senate. Will be reintroduced after recess.
- Proposed to end the filibuster
- Expands voter registration
- Would require states to provide secured drop boxes in elections for federal office

H.R. 4

The John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act

- Proposed by Congress to restore vital provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 (VRA)
- Proposes reinstatement of the VRA preclearance provision
- Would prevent voting rights restrictions
- Would eliminate heightened standard for challenging voter discrimination
- It is anticipated that H.R. 4 will be voted on by the US House this month (August 2021)
